Launched in July 2019, OWLS (Overcoming Worry, Loss and Sadness) Bereavement Service is funded by donations to the Jane Tomlinson Appeal and provides bereavement support for children aged 4-11, and their families, in Leeds.

OWLS has four main interventions:

- 1. Family support, including delivering psychoeducation, providing resources from the OWLS Lending Library and signposting to other useful resources
- 2. School support, including children's assemblies and staff bereavement support training
- 3. Monthly peer support for bereaved children to come together and undertake a range of activities including mindfulness and memorial craft to support them in their grief
- 4. 1-to-1 therapy delivered by a child psychotherapist for children most severely affected by their bereavement or who are experiencing complicated grief or trauma.

As the service continues to grow and develop, we are looking to recruit a part time **OWLS Support Worker**. This is an exciting time to join OWLS Bereavement Service and make a real difference to the lives of bereaved children and their families.

To be successful in this role you will have experience of working in a similar position and have a passion for working with young people and their families. You will have excellent communication skills and the ability to build rapport and positive, empathetic working relationships with bereaved families, schools and external partnership agencies.

The successful applicant will have a reporting base in Leeds and will be required to travel regularly to schools throughout the region: own transport and a full, clean driver's licence are essential.

The **OWLS Support Worker**'s core duties include:

- Assisting the Service Co-ordinator and Lead Therapist to meet the needs of the service
- Responding to initial enquiries from families, schools and other professionals
- Undertaking initial assessments including delivering psychoeducation on how children experience grief with families and schools to establish the required OWLS interventions
- Building and maintaining positive working relationships with service users, their families, schools and other agencies
- Delivering bereavement training to schools and external partnership agencies
- Delivering assemblies to primary school children on the themes of remembrance and loss
- Maintaining accurate databases and files through Microsoft Office and email
- Commitment to confidentiality and acting in accordance with GDPR
- Prompt reporting of safeguarding concerns to the Designated Safeguarding Lead
- Pro-rata weekend working to attend a proportion of the peer support activity days as agreed by the Service Co-ordinator
